Desserts for School Events	Have students prepare desserts that can be sold at different school events (ex. Basketball game).	This would have to be approved by your local administration.

Runza Nights	Many Runza franchises will hold fundraisers for nonprofit groups. Normally, a group will receive a 3-4 hour time slot. A share of any profit that is made during said time slot will be given to your FCCLA chapter in exchange for encouraging supporters to eat there.	This is something that needs to be discussed with your local Runza as each location may have different regulations on fundraisers. This fundraiser also requires a lot of advertising to get the word out there.
Paper Chain War	Each grade level competes to make the longest chain. Each grade makes a different color chain. Links can be sold for .50 to \$1 each. You can then offer a prize to the grade level that has the longest chain at the end of the allotted time frame for competition.	This would have to be approved by your local administration.

Flamingo Flocking	Purchase pink plastic flamingos (lawn decorations). Pick a few yards in your community to be the lucky recipients. Attach cards to the flamingoes' necks with a phone number along with all the pertinent information regarding FCCLA. State that for a \$10 donation, the flamingos will be removed but for \$15 they will be moved to the lawn of their choice. Make sure you also place a sign that has a contact name and phone number among the flamingos for those who drive by and would like to have the flamingos placed in a friend's yard. Allow people the option to purchase "Insurance" for \$10 from having the flamingos placed in their yard.	This fundraiser can be implemented in a variety of different ways with a variety of different objects—It doesn't necessarily have to be flamingos! Outhouses have been done, and even jumbo rubber ducks! Think outside of the box! It also is a good idea to send letters out to people who have some kind of connection to your organization, allowing those people first chance to decide whose yards they would like the flamingos placed in and allowing them to purchase insurance in advance.
Penny Wars	This is a fundraiser that could easily be completed school wide. Each class/grade gets a large glass jar. Each jar is clearly labeled and placed in a central location at your school. The goal is for each class to fill the jar up with as many pennies as possible. Only pennies count toward the total so different grades are supposed to sabotage one another by placing higher value currency in jars that aren't their own. A prize should be offered for the winner grade or class!	This would have to be approved by local administration.
Parents' Night Out	Offer a babysitting night at your school around the holidays or Valentine's Day	This would have to be approved by local administration.

	when parents may desperately need a night out. Have chapter members volunteer to work different shifts of the night and to lead different activities for the kids. Advertise around town and have parents reserve spots for their kids. Charge them a flat fee for their children's participation.	
Cow Patty Blocks	First you'll need a cow, and a hall, field, or pen for this fundraiser! Mark out blocks on your venue. People then purchase blocks where they think the cow will drop its patty. When all the blocks are sold, the cows will be let in and the wait will begin. The winner gets a prize!	Your contact will depend on where your event will be hosted. You will also have to have a great prize for this event so you'll have to go around to local businesses prior to make sure you have a worthwhile prize.
Kiss the Pig (or make your favorite teacher do another embarrassing task)	Set out collection jars for teachers that agree to be a part of your fundraiser. Students will drop money into the jars of the teachers that they would like to see kiss a pig or do another embarrassing task. The teacher with the most money has to complete the task!	This would require permission from your local administration, and you also need to have a day where you call an all school assembly for the task to be completed in front of the student body.
Embarrassment cards	Make up some cards with crazy, embarrassing things on them for people to do. For example, doing the Hokey Pokey or singing "Old MacDonald Had a Farm." Have someone select a random card and read it, then tell them that they can either do what the card says or make a donation.	This would be something that would be best done in some kind of public place. It could be done during school lunch period with administrative permission, or at a sporting event to get the community involved!
Students vs. Teachers basketball game	Charge admission to and sell concessions for a student vs. staff basketball game. This could be done during school or after-school.	This would require permission from local administration and willing staff and students.



Sticky Fly	Sell pieces of duct tape for students to stick your principal (or other teacher) to a wall.	This will require permission from local administration and a free time during the day where students can purchase duct tape. You could sell duct tape in advance and then allow only the students that purchased tape to be present for the event or host a school wide event and sell and tape simultaneously.
Pajama Day	Allow students to pay \$1 (or more) to wear pajamas to school for a day.	This would require permission from local administration. You also will need a way to make sure students have actually paid the money to wear the pajamas. This could be done by having chapter members or teachers stand at doors as students enter to collect money and give students a stamp or wristband to prove that they have paid.
Principal for a Day	Allow students to buy raffle tickets for the chance to be the principal for the day. The student that wins gets to hang out in the principal's office for the day and the principal must go to the winning student's classes.	This fundraiser obviously requires principal permission and it is best to be done when classes aren't too busy (i.e. not during finals week).
Kiss a Senior Goodbye (or Kiss a Freshman Hello)	School population, parents, teachers, and staff are invited to give seniors a sweet send-off in the form of a Hershey's Kiss and a personal message.	Permission of local administration is required. Parents of the graduating class should also be contacted and given a form so they can personalize a message to their child or even friends of their child's. Sell the Kisses at before and after school or during lunch periods to other students and teachers.
Couch Potato	Sell tickets at home football, basketball or volleyball events for the chance to watch the action from a couch. The winner would be allowed to bring a few friends with him or her to sit on the couch as well as be provided with a voucher to the concession stand.	Permission from local administration along with the coaches of the sports teams is required. You will have to have members at the sporting events where this is offered to sell tickets. You could draw tickets after the first quarter or set of play.
"Crush" Cans	Around Valentine's Day, allow students the option to purchase cans of Crush soda that say something along the lines of "I've got a 'Crush' on you" printed on a label. These can be sold before or	Permission from local administration is required. You will also need to find a time for cans to be delivered to students.
