

Nebraska FCCLA State Degree Program Presentation Scoring Rubric

Nebraska FCCLA State Degree Program, is an individual event that is designed to provide for the development and recognition of the well-rounded FCCLA leader. This event, reflects the mission of FCCLA and includes: personal growth, leadership development, promotion of Family and Consumer Sciences and related skills, and involvement in FCCLA.

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Members that complete a portfolio which includes all required elements based on the evaluation checklist are eligible for a presentation time with an evaluation committee.
- 2. Participation is open to any nationally affiliated FCCLA member during their senior year. If a student graduates at the end of the fall semester of their senior year, they will not be eligible for the State Degree.
- 3. Participants must be registered to attend the State Leadership Conference in order to be recognized and receive their State Degree.

PROCEDURES & TIME REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The schedule for participants will be shared at least one week prior to the presentation date. Participants should address questions to the State Adviser prior to the event.
- 2. The participant will have up to 5 minutes to set-up their portfolio device (laptop, tablet, etc.). No electricity will be provided. The evaluation committee, which has already seen the participant's portfolio, will be seated 3-5 feet in front of the participant so a projector is not necessary.
- 3. At the designated time, the participant will give a presentation of up to 10 minutes in length. This presentation must include responses to each of the following questions:
 - What was the most challenging component of the portfolio?
 - What component of the portfolio you are proudest of?
 - What component of the portfolio taught you the most about Family and Consumer Sciences?
 - What component demonstrates a program or initiative you will continue to be involved in?

These questions are not inclusive and additional content may be added by the participant. The presentation should not be a report on every portfolio item included as the portfolio is evaluated independent of the presentation. However, the participant may add additional information about their portfolio or some of the items in it as they deem necessary or beneficial.

- 4. Participants may not use note cards. No other presentation elements such as music or visuals are allowed.
- 5. At the conclusion of the presentation, the evaluation committee will ask the participant to answer questions concerning the participant's experiences in FCCLA and State Degree. These questions may include:
 - How do you plan on staying involved in FCCLA in the future?
 - Who contributed to your FCCLA experiences reflected in the portfolio?
 - Explain your decision to pursue the FCCLA State Degree and the process you went through.

These questions are not inclusive and additional questions may be asked by the evaluation committee. The interview will be limited to 5 minutes.

- 6. Evaluators will score and write comments for each entry for approximately 5 minutes. The decision of the evaluators is final.
- 7. Total time required for participation in this event is approximately 25 minutes including set-up, presentation, interview, and evaluator scoring.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Participants must score at least 90% on the presentation to receive a Nebraska FCCLA State Degree. There is no curve in scoring, and as such it is possible that all, or none, of the students that give a presentation may be awarded a degree.
- 2. Spectators are not allowed to observe this event.
- 3. Participants are not allowed to discuss the event with other participants. Doing so will result in disqualification.
- 4. Presentations may not be recorded or photographed, except by the Nebraska FCCLA Association.
